

The Battle Of Freiberg

29 October, 1762

In the sixth year of war Prince Henry, commanding mostly the second-rate troops that Frederick had left to him, took the offensive against the Reichsarmee and its supporting Austrian corps. Prince Stolberg's army was positioned on the hills west of Freiberg, blocking the approaches to Dresden. Henry scouted their positions on the 28th of October and resolved to attack the next day.

The Scenario:

The weather is Overcast. Start on Turn 1. Basic Length is 6 turns.

Terrain notes:

The allies have built entrenchments on the hilltops, and thus have cover. Woods are rough.

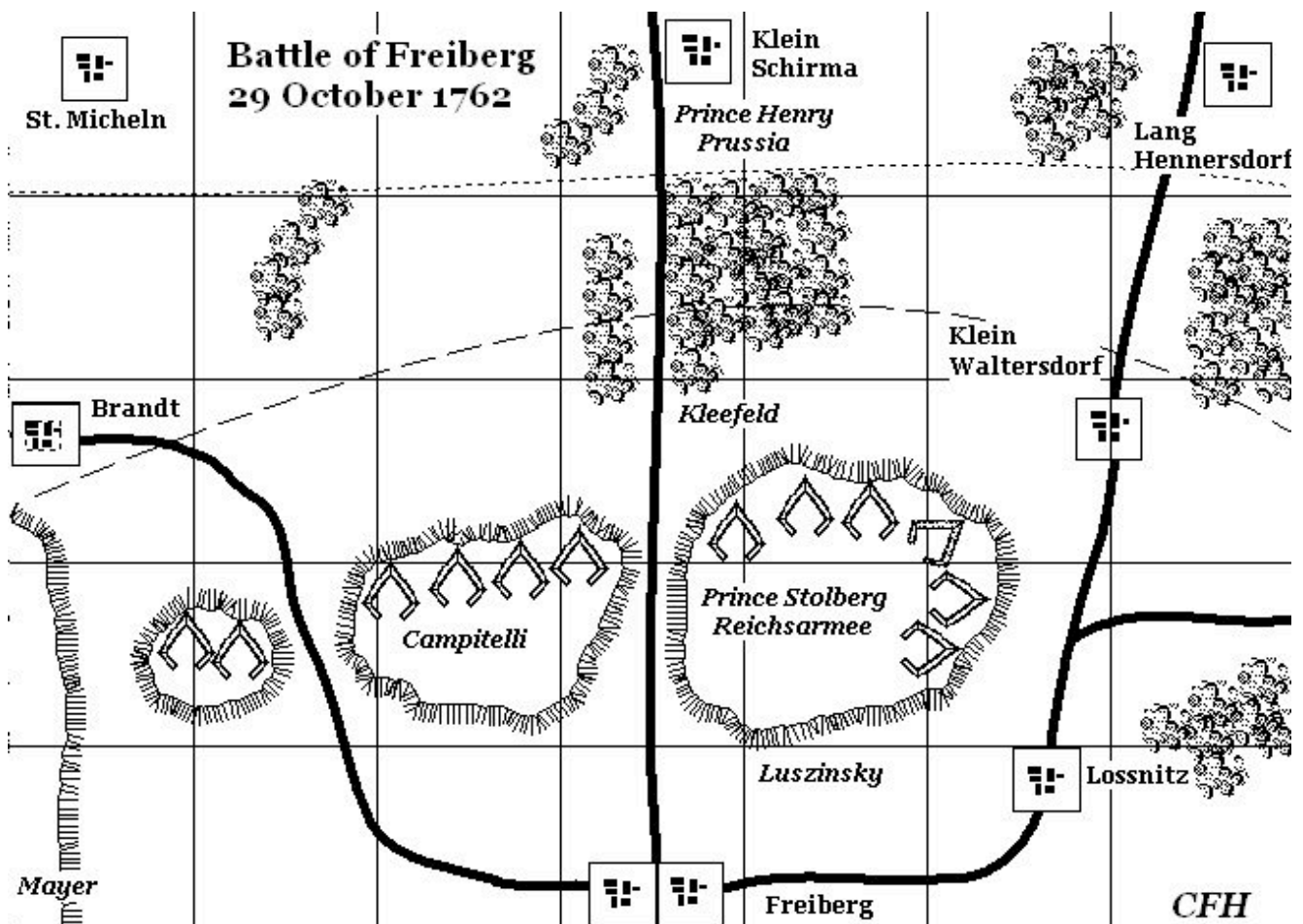
Map Scale: 1:100

Free Deployment Rules

Prussians to the North of the dotted line. Allies to the South of the dashed line.

Special Scenario Rules

Each of the two large hills is worth 1 point of army morale. If the Prussians take the hilltop (occupy it and drive all allied units from it), then they gain 1 army morale, and the allies lose one. If the allies retake it, reverse this.
